# What am I going to talk about?

- I will start by providing an overview of the options process and the courses and qualifications available.
- I will then take you through how to complete the options form which you will complete online using a Google Form.

# How have GCSEs changed?

- New (9-1) GCSEs were introduced in every subject our students study between 2017 and 2019.
- Almost all controlled assessment/ coursework has gone.
- In most subjects, all assessment is now by final (terminal) examination at the end of Year 11.
- The grading scale also changed from A\*-G to 9-1 (9 is the highest grade).

# How does the 9-1 scale work?

Old GCSE grades	New GCSE grades
A*	9
A	8
B	7
C	6
D	5
E	4
F	3

The government's benchmark for achievement for students in English and maths moved upwards. While the 'good pass' on the previous A\*-G scale was seen to be a C grade or above, the 9-1 GCSE 'standard pass' is a Grade 4 (C grade on old scale) and a 'strong pass' is a Grade 5 (high C/ low B) or above.

# Core Subjects

- Everyone takes a core group of subjects:
  - English Language and English Literature
  - Mathematics
  - Science
  - RS
  - PE (not examined)
  - ICT (used as a tool across all subjects)
  - PSHE (not examined)

# Option Subjects

- There is also a wide range of option subjects that you can choose from.
- These include:
  - GCSEs
  - Vocational Courses
  - Extra English and maths

# How many choices do I have?

- There are four slots for option subjects on your timetable.
- Each of these slots covers five one hour lessons across each fortnight.
- You will need to make **five option choices**.
- These will cover the four subjects which you want to take plus one reserve subject.
- Most subjects count as one choice but 'Life beyond school' will count as two.

# What happens next?

- After the options deadline I will construct the four option blocks.
- These are based on the choices which students make and also the staffing we have available.
- If a subject is under-subscribed we may not be able to run it.
- If this is the case we will be in contact with you about making a new choice.
- If there is a clash with your options based on these blocks, we will also be in contact.



# What happens if a subject is over-subscribed?

- There is, inevitably, a limit to the number of students we can put in a class.
- In most cases we cap the number of students at a maximum of 32 students.
- In some cases, the cap is lower – typically for equipment or health & safety purposes (e.g. Design Technology, Food). The cap is normally 16 in Food and 20 in DT.
- Where possible we will add another class to accommodate the students opting for the subject.
- However, this is sometimes not possible for staffing/ timetable reasons.
- There will be some subjects (e.g. BTEC Child Development, Design Technology, Food) **where we cannot run more than one group in each subject next year.**

# What happens if a subject is over-subscribed?

In the event of a subject being oversubscribed and the school being unable to expand provision to accommodate the additional students, the following criteria will be used (in rank order) to allocate places in order to ensure that we best meet the needs of our students:

1. Students with an identified SEND
2. Students who have not been allocated one or more of their other option choices owing to the construction of the option blocks
3. Students who have been allocated their other first choices but cannot be allocated their reserve subject owing to the construction of the option blocks
4. Once the first three groups have been allocated, the remaining students will be drawn through lots

In cases where we are not able to offer a student all his/ her choices, parents will be contacted and students will be advised about the alternatives available to them.

# Are there any combinations of subject I cannot opt for?

- Owing to the way our timetable is constructed you can only opt for **one** subject out of the following list:
  - Computing
  - Dance
  - Design Technology (DT)
  - Drama
  - Food Preparation & Nutrition
- If you are thinking about opting for Computing or Triple Science please make sure that you read about the entry requirements in the options booklet.
- Choosing Triple Science as an option may also have an impact on setting in mathematics.

# Computing

- We are delighted to be able to announce that we will be offering GCSE computing as an option this year.
- However, there will be an entry requirement for this course – mainly because it is a very hard subject requiring a high level of mathematical ability.
- The entry requirement is a predicted grade (based on the FFT estimates) of at least a Grade 7 in mathematics.
- We will be contacting the parents of the children who have met this requirement (by e-mail) by the end of this week.
- Please do not put Computing down as an option if you do not receive this e-mail.

# English Baccalaureate (EBacc.) subjects at GCSE

- We require that the majority of our students must opt for at least one EBacc. subject as part of their option choices.
- The EBacc. subjects we offer are:
  - Geography
  - History
  - Languages (French, German or Spanish)
  - Triple Science (Biology, Chemistry & Physics)
  - Computing
- We also require that **all** dual linguists will need to choose at least **one** language (unless they have an identified Special Educational Need).
- We also encourage single linguists to opt for a language.
- This can count as your EBacc. subject.
- We also **really encourage** students opting for a language to consider opting for Geography and/or History.

# Vocational Courses

(1 or 2 option choices each)

- We will be offering two work-related courses this year:
  - BTEC Technical Award Child Development  
(1 option choice)
  - Life Beyond School  
(2 option choices)
- These courses are linked to developing the skills needed in the workplace.

# BTEC Technical Award Child Development

(1 option choice)

- This course is based around studying content and developing skills which are relevant to specific vocational sectors (world of work).
- In the case of the BTEC Child Development course, it may involve some work placements.
- This course is equivalent to GCSEs and counts as 1 option choice.
- It involves the students completing one external exam and two coursework projects (completed under controlled conditions).



# Life Beyond school

(2 option choices)

- This is a course which we have put together ourselves to provide opportunities for students taking a reduced number of options.
- It will take up two of your child's option choices.
- Miss Collyer (our SENCO) will be in contact with you if we believe this is a suitable option.
- It involves a mixture of activities including:
  - Extra English, Maths and Science (where possible)
  - Mini work experience (if possible)
  - Developing life skills and skills to help students prepare for the world of work (e.g. managing money, writing a job application, leading an enterprise activity)

# Option block in Learning Support

- For a small number of students with significant Special Educational Needs, we work very hard to tailor your child's curriculum to their specific needs.
- This may involve spending 1 of their option blocks in Learning Support rather than in GCSE subjects.
- This time will be spent developing study skills and completing GCSE work.
- Miss Collyer (our SENCO) will be in contact with you if we believe this is a suitable option.

# Extra English and Maths

(1 option choice)

- While every subject is important, having strong literacy and numeracy skills is fundamental.
- This is in terms of both developing the skills themselves but also gaining good grades (Grade 4 or above) in these subjects.
- These skills will support you in your studies both at Gillotts and beyond.
- We are offering 'extra English and maths' as an option.
- This will take up **one** of your option choices.
- Around 25 students are being guided towards this option.
- You can only opt for this option if we have recommended it to you.
- It cannot be taken along with the Life Beyond School course.

# Options Letter

- You will be receiving an options letter (sent by e-mail) with a suggestion about the combination of subjects your child could take.
- It will also identify if your child is required to take a language at GCSE.
- If your child's letter states that they must take a language but they have an identified SEND (and you do not want them to take a language) please e-mail me.
- The letter will also contain a link to the Google Form which you should complete to show your child's option choices.
- If you have not received this e-mail by the end of the week, please contact your child's House base.

- Select one subject from the first group of subjects ('EBacc subjects') and then select three further single subjects from the second group of subjects ('Other subjects').
- This is unless you choose 'Life beyond school' from the 'Other subjects' list. As this counts as two choices, you should choose 'Life beyond school' plus one other subject in the 'Other subjects' section.
- Please also indicate a reserve subject in addition to the subjects you have chosen.
- Only students directed to choosing extra English & Maths in their options letter should select this choice.
- You are required to opt for a language if you are currently studying two languages in Year 9.
- Owing to timetable constraints you will only be able to choose one of the following subjects: Computing, Dance, Design Technology, Drama or Food Preparation & Nutrition.
- If you opt for Triple Science please make sure that your child will meet the entry requirements listed in the options booklet. If we have any concerns about your child opting for this subject, Mr West will contact parents/guardians following the options deadline.
- There is a high entry requirement in maths for GCSE computing (see options booklet). The parents of students who have met this entry requirement will be notified by e-mail.
