You need to be prepared for each exam – before the day of the exam

Make sure you know the following for each exam:

- the day it is on
- the time it will start
- the venue for the exam
- how long the exam will be

For each exam paper you need to be clear about:

- which topics will be examined
- how the exam will be structured

Classroom based exams

- Your exams in English, maths, RS and science will take place in your normal classrooms for these subjects.
- The art & design and music exams (for those students taking the subject as an option) will also take place in classrooms.
- The times of these exams are shown on the exam timetable and your teachers will have told you as well.
- If you are unsure, please ask your subject teacher.

Classroom based exams

- You will need to go to your normal classroom (or the classroom you have been told to go to by your teachers) at the start of the lesson when the exam is scheduled.
- You will be asked to keep all your belongings in your bags, including your phones/ mobile devices.

Hall-based exams

- **Make sure that you arrive early for the exams based in the Hall**
 - you should aim to arrive at least 10 minutes before the scheduled start of the exam (e.g. 8.35am for an 8.45am start and 1.20pm for a 1.30pm start)
- **Ensure that you follow the ‘normal’ exam rules:**
 - Leave your bags in the Hall foyer
 - No valuables should be left in your bags
 - Line up sensibly in the carpark behind the Hall in House lines
 - Do not talk once the teacher in charge asks for quiet
 - Enter the Hall in silence – and remain in silence unless asked to talk
 - Hand in your mobile phones (turned off) and watches when asked

You need to be prepared for each exam – bring the right equipment

For every exam you must bring:

- Black Biro/ pens (at least two)
- Calculator
- Pencils (at least two) – preferably HB
- Colouring pencils
- Ruler (preferably 30cm ruler)
- Eraser
- Protractor
- Pair of Compasses
- A clear pencil case / bag to keep everything in

Please also note that water bottles should not have any labels/ writing on them.
